As an alternative to conventional Medical Practice MARY BAKER EDDY managed to overcome her personal maladies through Scriptural-study and lay the foundation for what is commonly known as CHRISTIAN SCIENCE.

In the Twenty-first Century her Legacy lives on through the CHURCH OF CHRIST, SCIENTIST, headquartered at Boston, Massachusetts, with branches worldwide to accommodate its estimated 400,000 members; a pair of well-respected and widely-read publications - the CHRISTIAN SCIENCE MONITOR and the CHRISTIAN SCIENCE JOURNAL, and a textbook she wrote and published in 1875, entitled SCIENCE AND HEALTH with KEY TO THE SCRIPTURES.
